



## **Proportion of Boys in Top Two Bands by Subject**




### **Scots Boys Awarded Band 6**




State versus Scots Bands 5 and 6 combined





## The Quest for Excellence

### i.C.A.R.E

In 2020, we had an exponential increase in the number of academic achievements across Years 7 to 12, providing proof that Scots boys can and will continue to succeed in their academic pursuits despite any obstacle or difficulty placed in their path.

We had the highest number of ARTEXPRESS (Visual Arts), ENCORE (Music), OnSTAGE (Drama) and Shape (Design and Technology) nominations than any year prior for our Year 12 students' major works or performances. We had the highest number of High Distinction and Distinctions for the Science Olympiad than ever before, and the highest number of students sitting those exams.

For the first time we had boys sit the National Latin Exam and had several boys awarded at the highest level. As per usual, we had enormous success with Mathematics students in the Australian Mathematics Competition. Several Mathematics students were awarded highest standardised test results and William Liu (Year 9) and Edwin She (Year 11) were invited to attend the Australian Mathematical Olympiad Committee's School of Excellence in 2021.

In Learning Enrichment, over 50 students from Years 7 to 10 completed their Honours Capstone Project, with five boys awarded a Renaissance Man badge for projects spanning over multiple key disciplinary areas.

It has been an extremely pleasing academic year with boys' effort grades increasing overall, which has led to an improvement in students' Grade Point Average.

Congratulations to all the academic achievers for 2020.



At the founding of The Scots College in 1893, the moderator of the Presbyterian Church described its teachers as those who had won the highest honours in university, knew how to teach Australian boys, and saw their vocation as "a work of faith, a labour of love and a patience of hope".
